

Budget for Partney and Dalby Parish Council 2026/27

A Precept is a tax that Parish Council's charge their local electors to meet the Council's budget requirements.

Parish Councils do not receive any direct funding from central government and rely on their Precept plus any other income they generate from services or facilities they provide.

The Parish Council Precept is part of the Council Tax and is collected from local electors via their Council Tax payments.

The following budget was agreed at the meeting held on 13.01.2026.
